Four pieces of 1x2, 96", Pine Board
Five pieces of 1x3, 96", Pine Board
Three pieces of 1x4, 96", Pine Board
One piece of 1x5, 11', Pine Board
One piece of 1x6, 72", Pine Board
Two pieces of 2x2, 72", Pine Board
One piece of 2x4, 24", Pine Board
One Hundred 1 1/4" pocket hole screws
Twenty Four 1 1/4" wood screw #8
One Hundred 2" pocket hole screws
Twenty Four 2" wood screws #8
One Gallon of Primer
One Gallon of Paint
Sand

TOOLS NEEDED

STEP BY STEP BUILD PLAN

- 1. Pre-Build Cut List
 - a. One foot rest, 1 x 5 at 22 1/4"
 - b. Two foot rest rails, 1 x 4 at 30", one end 10 degree angle
 - c. One foot rest front apron, 1 x 3 at 17 3/4"
 - d. One back stretcher, 1 x 4 at 19 1/4"
 - e. Two arm rests, 1 x 5 at 27"
 - f. Two arms, 1 x 3 at 20 1/2"
 - g. One bottom back support, 2 x 4 at 17 3/4"
 - h. One middle back support, 1 x 5 at 24 1/4"
 - i. One top back support, 1 x 4 at 19"
 - j. Two front legs, 2 x 2 at 30", both ends 5 degree cut
 - k. Two back legs, 2 x 2 at 30", both ends 10 degree cut
 - I. Two seat side supports, 1 x 6 at 24 1/2"
 - m. Thirteen seat slats, 1 x 2 at 19 1/4"
 - n. Two back slats, 1 x 3 at 28"
 - o. Two back slats, 1 x 3 at 30"
 - p. Two back slats, 1 x 3 at 31"
- 2. Before assembly sand any sharp corners and cuts.
- 3. Attach the pieces of the chair together.
 - a. Attach the arms to the front leg using 2" countersunk screws. Make two opposing sets.
 - b. Assemble the lower stretcher. Attach foot rest side rails to the back of the stretcher using 1 1/4" pocket hole screws.
 - c. Attach the lower stretcher to the legs using 2" countersunk wood screws.
 - d. Attach the foot rest front apron to side rails using 1 1/4" pocket hole screws.
 - e. Attach the seat side supports to the legs using 2" countersunk screws.
 - f. Attach the back middle support to the arms using 1 ¼" pocket hole screws. Then attach to the back leg using 2" countersunk wood screws.
 - g. Attach the arm rests to the arm and back middle support using 1 ¼" countersunk screws from the underside.
 - h. Attach the foot rest to rails using 1 ¼" countersunk screws. Attach the seat slats to the supports using 1 ¼" countersunk screws.
 - i. Use a bandsaw to cut a curve into back slats before assembly.
 - j. Attach the back slats to the back bottom support using a 1 1/4" countersunk wood screw at centre of each board.
 - k. Attach the back bottom support to the seat side support rails using 2" pocket hole screw.
 - Adjust the back slats to fan out and rest against the back middle support.
 Attach them to the back middle support using 1 ¼" countersunk screw from the front.
 - m. Attach the back top support to the back slats if desired. Use 1 1/4" countersunk wood screws from front.
 - n. Locate a spot for the wine glass holder. Drill a 1 1/4" hole, cut a 3/4" slot from the outside edge of armrest in to the drilled hole using the jigsaw. Smooth the

edge of the slot and run a 1/4" roundover router bit around the slot and drilled hole.

- 4. Apply primer and sand to the step.5. Prime and paint the entire chair.
