ARMOIRE TO COFFEE HUTCH EYES FOR THE JOB- EPISODE 311.1 'COFFEE IN THE MORNING, SWING BED IN THE EVENING'



MATERIALS NEEDED

Armoire

Plastic Faux Tin enough to cover 23" x 27"
Wicker Style basket, no more than 6" tall
Hooks to hang glasses
1/4" MDF for back of armoire. 4"x 4" is plenty
2 buckets of Paint
Textured wall paper to fill space 16 square feet
Small roller sleeves and tray kits
Chalk Board Paint
Overhead LED Light

TOOLS NEEDED

Screw Gun
Drill bit
Palm Sander
Paint Brushes
Paint
Brown Glaze
Glue
2 x 2ft Steel Silver Lay-in Ceiling Tile
Chalk Board Paint
Chalk



STEP BY STEP BUILD PLAN

- 1. Begin by using the palm sander and lightly sand the entirety of the unit, we want to achieve and aged, weathered appearance.
- Once sanding is complete, apply 1 thin coat of paint, both inside and out, you can choose whichever colour you wish. Once painting is complete, you can apply the brown stain, this will enhance the aging effect and give the armoire the desired appearance.
- 3. Once the unit has dried completely. Lightly sand again to finalize the overall aged appearance. Assemble the faux tin backing piece, and screw or glue into place,

- completely covering the hole in the backing piece. Screw holes into ceiling of unit, 3 holes with space enough to hang coffee mugs without them contacting one another or the wall, on either side of units interior ceiling.
- 4. Install hooks on the ceiling of the armoire. These will serve as places to hang mugs and glasses.
- 5. Using a 1" drill bit, drill directly centre into the units ceiling, this is so you can feed in a socket for a light bulb.
- 6. Apply paint and wallpaper to a piece of 1/4 plywood and glue it to cover the void on the back,
- 7. Another suggestion for this unit is a Hanging Chalk Board, for reminders and or fun affirmations, or perhaps good coffee recipes. A mirror to help reflect/refract light, and to add depth to the unit.
